Measuring Instructions

The best way to start this process is to draw a top view of the room(s) and indicate the dimensions for each wall (Do not measure the cabinets themselves). These measurements are to be a guideline for our designers to work from, and get a design put together. They are not meant to be One Hundred percent accurate. We recommend measuring each area twice to ensure the most accurate dimension.

- 1. Measure the room from wall to wall.
- 2. Measure your ceiling height and note if there are any existing bulkheads that will need either be removed or worked into the new plan. Bulk heads can either be empty or contain duct work/pipes.
- 3. Note on the drawing where all door openings and windows are located. Measure these areas from outer casings or door trims.
- 4. Measure to locate the centers of your sink and appliances (even if the locations may change)
- 5. Indicate on the drawings where there is electrical elements, Ie: Light switches and/or plugs
- 6. If you have blueprints from the builder or architect, please bring these in as well, as they will be of great help.
